





Netwar in Cyberia: Decoding the Media Mujahedeen and the Jihadist Swarmcast

At the dawn of mass access to the internet, some foresaw that dissident groups would use technological innovation and the networks of our postmodern society in unconventional ways and toward subversive goals. That time has come. Through a strategic assessment of information dissemination systems, this project will identify factors which could influence the success of public diplomacy responses to Jihadist online content.

CPD RESEARCH FELLOW PROJECT

From Crawling to Walking: Progress in Evaluating the Effectiveness of Public Diplomacy (Lessons Learned from NATO)

Assessment and evaluation of public diplomacy remains an undeveloped study area. Governments, institutions and international organizations continue to struggle in defining the right approach to evaluate the impact of their programs on their audiences. This research aims to provide an insight into how NATO designed and implemented assessment and evaluation of its public diplomacy programs.

Journalism with Purpose: Foreign Policy, Domestic Politics & U.S. International Broadcasting

In the midst of what some scholars have called a "global communications arms race" the U.S. House of Representatives is considering legislation to overhaul the structure of U.S. international broadcasting. This project considers historical context for today's legislative debates.

CPD Doctoral Dissertation Grants

This year's Doctoral Dissertation Grants recipients were **Aleksandra Sasa Gorisek**, a Ph.D. Candidate at University of Vienna, and **Vanessa Leon**, a Ph.D. Candidate at Florida International University. Ms. Gorisek's project is titled "Multi-Stakeholder Internet Governance: Public Diplomacy of Non-State Public Actors" and examines strategic public diplomacy approaches that non-state actors use

while participating in internet governance debates in order to reach their goals. Ms. Leon's project, "Status Competition Between the U.S. and China on the Stage of Africa" aims to examine whether recent Chinese activities in Africa have stimulated status competition between the U.S. and China, causing the U.S. to act in highly symbolic ways even if there appear to be few material gains.

CPDPUBLICATIONS

CPD is the premier publication venue for public diplomacy scholars and practitioners. Each year, our international roster of authors contribute substantially to the expanding body of public diplomacy literature. Our publications include the *CPD Perspectives on Public Diplomacy* series, the CPD Blog, as well as the CPD Annual Review, discussion papers, interviews, e-books, and the student-run *PD Magazine*.

The CPD Perspectives on Public Diplomacy series

Since 2009, the *CPD Perspectives* series has highlighted critical thinking about the study and practice of public diplomacy by CPD staff, fellows, scholars and practitioners. During the 2015-2016 academic year, CPD published seven papers. Subjects ranged from the PD of Indonesia to global health to the intersections between PD and international development.






