

# **CPD BY THE NUMBERS: FY17-18**

Since 2003, the USC Center on Public Diplomacy (CPD) has been a recognized leader in research, analysis and professional education with a reputation as the most comprehensive resource on public diplomacy, cultural relations and global engagement. CPD is building the field of public diplomacy into a strong and sustainable facet of international relations grounded in academic theory with an emphasis on practical application. The following is a numerical overview of CPD's accomplishments from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018:
